In late 1851, when news of major gold finds in the Forest Creek / Mount Alexander (Castlemaine) area began to circulate, a 'rush' resulted which then extended to Sandhurst (Bendigo).

As well as those who travelled by ship via Melbourne, a significant number of travellers made their way overland from SOUTH AUSTRALIA - a journey of approximately 460 miles (740 kms) from ADELAIDE. Depending on the route taken, the method of travel and difficulties encountered, it could take up to 10 weeks.

How many people are descended from those who made this journey?
